

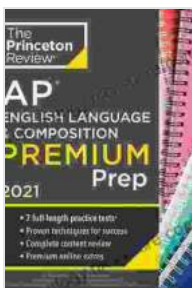
AP English Language and Composition: A Comprehensive Guide to the Advanced Placement Exam

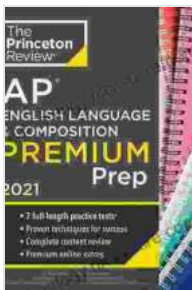

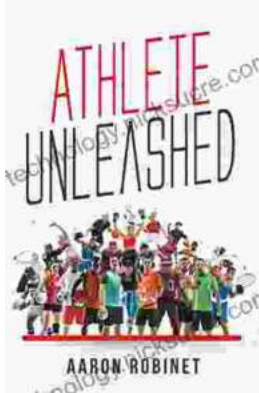


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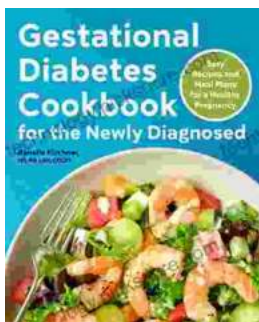
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
