

Glenn "Doc" Rivers: On Life in the NBA and Beyond

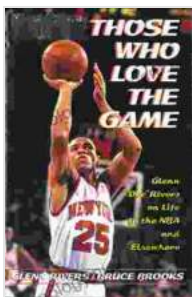
